Rewards

As your children may have explained to you, we are stepping away from Team Points as part of our reward system this year.

We were finding that instead of having positive conversations with children and adults about why they had received praise, we were instead focussing on how many points had been received and comparing previous years or even other children. We felt that this was taking away from the praise itself. Rest assured children will receive just as much praise and positive recognition as before, but it will be more specific and directed to them. With the introduction of Class Dojo, we also intend to be sharing more specific praise and feedback with you at home so that you can celebrate with your child the many successes they experience whilst they are at school.

Our successful P.T.F.A. have shared their planned events for the Autumn Term with you so that you can plan which ones you are able/wish to support. We are so lucky to have such an enthusiastic group of parents/carers who volunteer so readily to enhance the school experience for your children.
