

Reception Curriculum

Reception marks most children's very first step into formal schooling. This can be an exciting and nerve-wracking time for children and parents alike! Your child will start learning through play. They will be busy exploring, discovering, and listening to stories. They will be getting used to the school environment and learning to concentrate and listen to the teacher.

In Reception, your child will follow the New Early Years Adopters Curriculum. This sets the standards for the learning, development, and care of your child. The things your child will learn in Reception have been organised into three prime areas of learning:

- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Personal and Social Development

And four specific areas of learning:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

In the EYFS, play is a very important part of your child's development and most learning will be introduced through a mixture of carefully planned play and some adult-led focused activities. There will also be opportunities for your child to choose activities that appeal to them, following their own particular interests.
